

COVID-19 Vaccination Data Guide

Summary Data Points

Data Definitions

Doses Delivered (Source: DC Health via Tiberius): The number of COVID-19 Vaccine doses physically received by healthcare providers in the District of Columbia as of 6:00a on the Wednesday before.

Doses Administered (Source: DC Health via the District of Columbia Immunization Information System (DOCIIS)): The number of COVID-19 Vaccine doses administrations reported to DOCIIS as of the Saturday before.

COVID-19 Vaccine Dose Administration by Residency and Dose Number

Source: DC Health via DOCIIS. Data subject to change on a daily basis.

Metric Definition: The number of individuals given the first or second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine (any formulation). First dose is the first reported vaccine administration date for each individual. Second doses must be a minimum of 2 weeks after the first dose. Residency determined by stated home address.

Data Notes: Due to onboarding of facilities to the reporting system between December 2020 and January 2021, we expect the reported numbers to be an underestimate of actual administered vaccines. Phase 1a (December 2020 through approximately mid-January 2021) will have a disproportionate amount of non-DC-residents who have been administered vaccines because all healthcare workers who work in DC are included in this phase, regardless of residency. Data are updated weekly on Mondays and show vaccines administered through the previous Thursday.
