

DC Health is expanding the criteria/priority groups for testing to allow some asymptomatic individuals who have a history of exposure and are in high-risk groups to be prioritized for testing.

REMINDERS

- Doctors decide who gets tested
- Testing asymptomatic people with exposure does not eliminate their need to self-quarantine if they have been instructed to do so
