To request transportation to a cooling shelter for a person experiencing homelessness, call (202) 399-7093 or call 311.



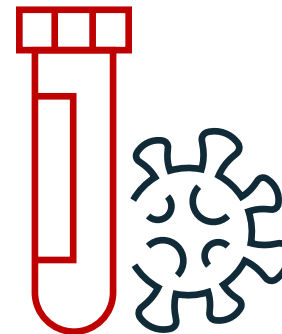
If a person is experiencing a medical emergency, call 911.

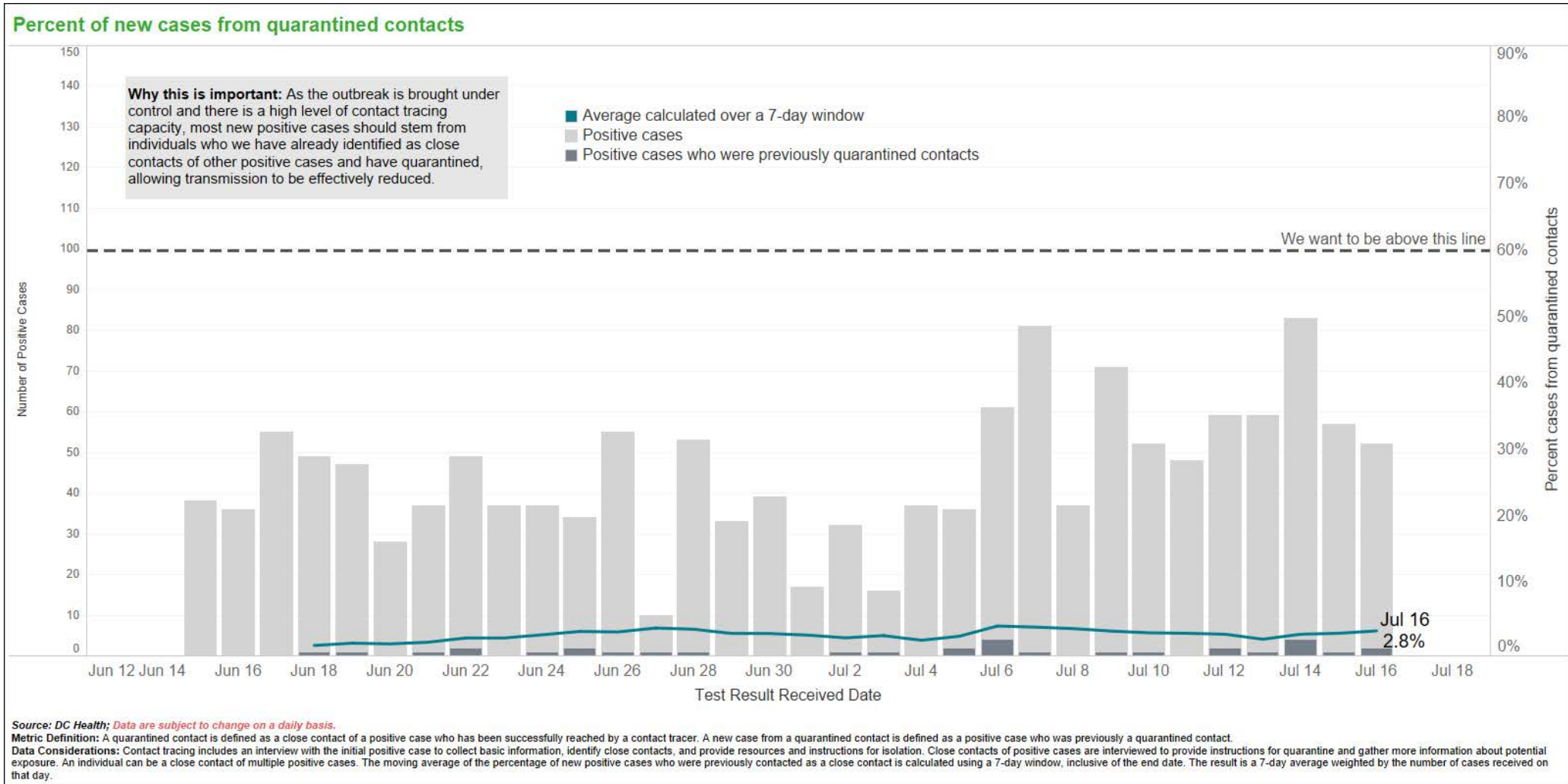

The Contact Trace Force is preparing to activate a Home Visit Team.



This Home Visit Team will conduct home visits and community outreach to individuals in the District who have tested positive for COVID-19 and their established contacts who have been placed in isolation or quarantine.



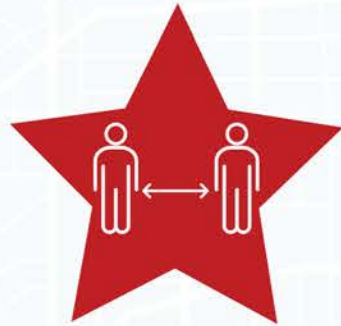
The team will **assess an individual's need for additional social services**, including alternative housing, food, and/or medication. Investigators will also assess a person's ability to safely quarantine or isolate, and, if necessary, connect residents to additional resources.
