

- Sunday, May 3: **154**


Total Positives **5,170**



# Greater Risk of COVID-19 Complications


People **65 years and older**, especially those with other health conditions

People of all ages with **underlying medical conditions**, particularly if not well controlled, including:

- High blood pressure and other serious heart conditions
- Diabetes
- Chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
- Severe obesity
- Chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis

- Liver disease
- Immunocompromised

Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including: cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications



- ✔ Continue your **medications** and do not change your treatment plan without talking to your doctor.
- ✔ Have at least a **2-week supply** of prescription and non-prescription medications.





### Heart Attack Symptoms

- Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain in the center of your chest
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort
- Cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

### Stroke Symptoms

- Face drooping
- Arm weakness
- Slurred speech
