



Update on Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department Operating Status during COVID-19 Emergency

What is our operating status?

The Fire and EMS Department continues all operations and services related to 911 emergency response.

How does this impact what we do?

While there is no adjustment to our emergency response, the Office of the Fire Chief is closed to in-person visitors and essential administrative units will telework to continue essential services and to support the Department's COVID-19 response. Responses to previously scheduled or future requests for public education and training, including requests for free smoke detectors, will be put on hold temporarily.

How does this impact our physical locations?

Our 33 fire stations and Marine Firefighting Unit are open as normal. The Fire Academy has ceased training.

What precautions are we taking to limit the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19)?

Our employees are taking precautions to keep themselves healthy and limit the spread of infections by wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) on medical responses, regularly reporting potential COVID-19 cases to DC Health, referring non-emergency calls to the NTL, and decontaminating equipment and facilities on a frequent basis. We are regularly washing our hands, reducing close contact with each other and residents.
