NEW MAYOR'S ORDER:

REQUIREMENT TO SELF-QUARANTINE AFTER NONESSENTIAL TRAVEL



Nonessential Travel

Beginning Monday, July 27, anyone coming into Washington, DC from a high-risk area who was not traveling for essential activities will be required to self-quarantine for 14 days.

The order excludes Maryland and Virginia. DC Health will publish a list of high-risk areas on coronavirus.dc.gov and update it every two weeks.

If people come into Washington, DC from a high-risk area

because they are returning home after performing an essential duty

because they are coming here in order to perform an essential duty

they should only leave home/where they are staying in order to perform essential activities.

High-risk areas are locations where the seven-day moving average of daily new COVID-19 cases is

10 or more per 100,000 people.

Colleges and Universities

Today, we sent a letter to colleges and universities regarding their plans for reopening and further guidance around:

- Testing
- Contact Tracing

- Student Behavior
- Isolation and Quarantine

Students arriving from high-risk areas will be required to self-quarantine for 14 days.

Possible Phase Two Interventions

For now, no additional arts and entertainment waivers will be issued.
